








VIRTUAL 2021 WEATHER COURSE

One goal I made for myself when I used to see the course listed way back when I lived in NJ was to take and finish the boating engine maintenance class.


2021 was the year that came to pass. So what business do I have taking this course, when I only own a kayak?



June-July 2021 Fleet Captain's Report

As the cruising directions for this year's Commander's Cruise have been delivered by mail rather than in person due to the pandemic I took the opportunity to determine the delivery efficiency of ordinary first class mail between my local post office in Kulpsville, PA and the post office of the participating captains as I have heard that not all post offices in our area are as efficient as others. The results of the information supplied by most of the participating boat captains is shown below.

Returning to the business of safe boating there are a number of new problems to deal with. Regarding the important navigating technique of using range lights it has been reported that Shad Battery Shoal range rear light is extinguished as well as Elk River Channel South range light.

If you are looking for a place to anchor for a pleasant afternoon or evening choose another place than Sandy Point State Park unless you wish to practice your dead reckoning navigational skills due to nav aid problems listed below.

south of Kent Island Narrows North Approach Light 3 there is a submerged metallic object East of center of the channel. (Editors Note: Later reports from the local BOAT/US operator and others state that there is no object in the channel based on multiple sweeps in the area using sonar. The original report is believed to have come from a boater that strayed outside the marked channel. Nonetheless, as always, use caution when transiting this area.)

Also in the Kent Island North Approach Channel, shoaling to a depth of four feet between North Approach Light 2KN and Light 8 has been reported.

Shoaling has been reported in the Choptank River's Slaughter Creek in two locations. One location In the channel bordered by Light 2SC and a point 50 to 100 yards east. Depths of 3-4 feet have been reported. Shoaling to 5 feet MLW has been observed on the red side of the channel between Buoy 6 and 8.

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New Federal Safety Requirement

Under a new federal law effective April 1, 2021, those piloting boats less than 26 feet in length are required to use their engine cut-off switches (ECOS) much of the time. That means wearing a lanyard—aka ECOS link—while at the wheel. (Formerly referred to as, "kill switches," the term engine cut-off switch, or ECOS, is the preferred nomenclature, whether referring to engine-cut-off switches operated by a physical lanyard or any of several electronic solutions.)

Sea Tow Automated Radio Check System no longer available:

For several years, Sea Tow operated an Automated Radio Check System, which was available on VHF Channels 24 to 28 for the benefit of mariners in over 130 locations. However, on October 2nd, 2020 that service was discontinued.

How to test a VHF Radio using Rescue 21:

The U.S. Coast Guard continues to offer an automated Digital Selective Calling (DSC) Test Call capability from each of its Rescue 21 coastal stations. All fixed mount marine radios certified by the Federal Communications Commission since 1999 are required to have a DSC capability. All such radios sold since 2011 must also have a DSC test call capability. Marine radios transmitting and successfully receiving a response from a DSC test call can be expected to operate acceptably in the voice mode as well.

To perform a DSC Test Call, enter the U.S. Coast Guard's coast station group identity "003669999" into the radio's DSC memory. Once entered and stored, a DSC test call can be made by executing the following three steps:

- 1. Select "Test Call" from the radio's DSC menu,
- 2. Select the USCG number entered into memory, and
- 3. Transmit the call.

The radio display should indicate when that test call is acknowledged and display the acknowledging station's nine-digit identity. That identity may be different than the group identity previously entered into memory.

Please use VHF Channel 09 and do not use VHF Channel 16:VHF Channel 16 is not for the purpose of radio checks. Please use VHF Channel 09, which has been designated by the FCC as a boater's calling channel.


