New Fire Extinguisher Regulations

The U.S. Coast Guard has issued new fire extinguisher regulations for motorized recreational boats that are effective starting April 20, 2022.

The new rules do not include changes for when and how many fire extinguishers are required on boats, If your boat was required to carry a fire extinguisher(s), those requirements still remain in effect.

USCG now uses the Underwriters Laboratory, UL, performance-based classification system for portable fire extinguishers. Most extinguishers already have USCG and UL rating classifications, and all approved extinguishers installed before August 22, 2016, can remain on recreational vessels as long as they are serviceable and less than 12 years old.

The new classification system requires portable and semi-portable extinguishers to be marked with a combined number and letter designation. The letter designates the class of fire the extinguisher is suitable for, and the number indicates the extinguishing potential.

Fishing the St. Lawrence

The St. Lawrence separates Canada and the USA. It is known for great fishing and it lived up to its reputation this spring. The St. Lawrence is deep, over 200 feet, however a large rock may be lurking beneath the surface at one foot. Many boaters have sacrificed their lower units to the river.



In early May the Juzbasich fishing team headed north to this treacherous waterway. During the winter they prepared in advance, mapping out

courses, probable fishing holes, and dangerous passages on their Lowrance navigation system.



The hard work paid off, no contact with

unfriendly rocks and very successful fishing. On their first day they caught over 200 fish and about 100 were "keepers". At times they were hauling them in two at a time!

Sound Waves

This article stems from a news report about the Frankford Boat Launch being closed for the season due to noise pollution. Fox 29 Philadelphia reported that both Pennsylvania and New Jersey residents are disturbed by the excessive noise levels caused not only by power boats, but also motorcycles, ATVs, and boom parties. Keep in mind that water helps noise travel.

During my research on the marine noise laws I was surprised that most seas are unregulated when it comes to ocean noise. Comparing four states frequently used for water activities by our members, Pennsylvania has one of the highest boating noise regulations. Pennsylvania has a maximum noise level for motorboats and muffler laws between 88 dB(a) and 90 dB(a) depending on what year your boat/motor was manufactured. Where Delaware had the least. Delaware has no maximum noise level for motorboats and that's where it ends. (Source: https://www.uscgboating.org/regulations/state-boating-laws-details. php?id=19&title)

The United States Coast Guard does have recommended guidelines to the U.S. maritime industry for addressing conditions of high noise. You can find them here but keep in mind they are guidelines. https://www.dco.uscg.mil/Portals/9/DCO%20Documents/5p/5ps/NVIC/1982/ n12-82.pdf. These recommendations are put in place to protect people from hearing loss, to help them safely function on the vessels, and to not be blocked from hearing audible alarms and warnings.

What you can do now is keep a well maintained engine, use personal audio devices at tolerable level, and drive slower, especially where your boat can cause a lot of noise disturbance.

In the future, electric power boats may be a welcome alternative solution to controlling sound levels. But in the meantime, I'll leave you with this: quieter seas are healthier seas.
