The Forward Throttle Award, Yesterday and Today

It was several years ago, in 2002, when the Forward Throttle Award was conceptualized and presented for the very first time. Zahnisers Yachting Center was the location and the culprits include Gary Armstrong and Esteban Nunez. We had concluded that the MLSPS summer cruise needed something to bring the event to a close that would be fun and interesting. The first idea we came up with was to invent an award and give it to the vessel/crew that showed the best qualities of teamwork, seamanship, safety on the water and navigational skill.

On the other hand, we thought, maybe we should just come up with reasons, real or imagined, and, if necessary, exaggerate any slip-up, mistake, oversight or minor transgression we discovered over the course of the cruise with the intent of eliminating boats one by one until the only one was left would, by default, win the award.

We went with Plan B.

We hustled over to the nearest marine store to find something we could use to cobble together some sort of plaque. We found a teak outlet cover, some plastic helm labels and a piece of rope that would do just fine. Of course, we never thought the award would continue on past the first year, (who knew that our members would so enjoy hearing how much they screwed up) so it wasn't fancy nor did we have a place for any of the winners names on the plaque. All of that came later, in 2004 to be exact, when that year's winner, Wind Elephant, decided to have the outlet cover mounted on a proper hunk of wood and also added engraved brass nameplates.

Back to 2002... Flying Angel won the inaugural Forward Throttle award and it has been presented annually ever since on the last evening of the summer cruise. The original outlet cover now has grown to include not one, but two hunks of wood and it actually looks like we planned it that way all along. And Now let's jump into the Wayback Machine and revisit some of the memories from the 2008 Summer Cruise (excerpted from a previous Pilot).


Forward Throttle 2008

So, the 2008 winner of the 2008 Forward Throttle award was Goldilochs.


